

**Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC)
and
Military Family Life Counselor Pro Re Nata (MFLC PRN)**
(This job description applies to both positions)

Counselors provide in-person, confidential, non-medical counseling services that benefit military personnel and families either at sites with active-duty personnel, in child development centers with young military children, or in schools with school-aged military students.

Minimum Training: Master's degree in clinically relevant field from an accredited university.

Experience:

- Demonstrated counseling competence required
- Post-license experience working with individuals and families in the areas of relationships, behavior management, coping skills, parenting skills/education, child development, separation, stress management, single parenting, step-parenting, family separation, reunion and reintegration, assessments, and referrals is preferred
- Prior non-medical counseling or EAP experience is preferred but not required
- Prior affiliation with the military is preferred but not required
- Counselors desiring to work with youth in child development centers are required to have a minimum of 1,500 hours of experience working with children of all ages, infant to teen

Licensure: Possess and maintain full license to practice independently at the master's or doctoral level as a Licensed Professional Counselor, Clinical Social Worker, Marriage Family Therapist, or Psychologist without restrictions or supervision (i.e. LCSW, LISW, MFT, LPCC, etc.) in the state where the counseling will be practiced.

Physical Requirements: The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

- While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to sit, stand, walk, talk, or hear.
- Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision and color vision.
- The employee is regularly required to use hands to finger, handle or feel; reach with hands and arms; climb or balance and taste or smell.

Additional Requirements: All counselors require U.S. citizenship and all assignments require counselor to successfully complete a security clearance.

Work Environment: The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform these essential functions.

- While performing the duties of this job, the employee is occasionally exposed to wet, humid, cold, and hot conditions.
- The noise level in the work environment ranges regularly from quiet to loud.
